### **Position Summary:**

A part-time contract position is available for a youth worker tutor capable of supporting a diverse range of youth in an after-school drop-in space at The Broadway Youth Resource Centre.

The preferred candidate will have an educational background in Math/Sciences and be comfortable tutoring Math, Science, Biology, Chemistry, and/or Physics for high school grade levels (grades 8 - 12). The candidate will also be comfortable supporting youth in Adult Basic Education (ABE) courses, self-paced curricula, and basic literacy. Experience working with marginalized students who may struggle with learning disabilities and/or mental health issues would be a strong asset. The ability to develop an excellent rapport with young people of various socioeconomic and cultural backgrounds, as well as a solid understanding of education barriers faced by youth is required.

The successful candidate will be dynamic, articulate, non-judgmental, and passionate about working with marginalized youth. The preferred candidate will also be grounded in a strong anti-racist, anti-oppressive, and/or social justice framework and take a trauma-informed approach to engaging youth.

### **Primary Duties:**

#### **1) Academic Tutoring:**

- Tutor Math and Science subjects, primarily on a one-on-one basis, to youth who require academic support.
- Help students with completing homework assignments, understanding key concepts and studying for quizzes or tests.
- Help students stay on track with self-paced coursework through comprehension checks, lesson breakdowns, exercise grading, and assignments.



- Help youth prepare for assessment tests and entrance exams.
- Help youth develop basic literacy and/or math skills through the development of a tailored study plan as needed.

## 2) Mentorship & Support:

- Make youth feel welcome in the space by greeting and checking in with them on a regular basis.
- Establish connections and on-going relationships with youth.
- Help youth access resources as necessary via research and referrals.
- Highlight and celebrate the academic successes of youth in the space.
- Encourage youth connections with school and/or other educational institutions and initiatives.

- Learning disabilities training including ADHD, FASD, Autism, Dyslexia, and special needs
- Depression/Suicide/Mental Health Assessment Training
- Trauma-informed practice
