
Highlights from the 2023 Settlement & Integration Sector Survey


INTRODUCTION


As this was the second year the Sector Priorities Survey was released, it was also an opportunity to compare this year's results with the year prior and identify and patterns or trends.


About AMSSA



COMMUNITY APPROACH




FREQUENCY OF MEETING WITH SIMILAR SERVICE PROVIDING ORGANIZATIONS

SERVICE DELIVERY


As was the case last year, the survey revealed that hybrid service delivery (a combination of inperson and virtual) was the sector's preferred service delivery model. Interestingly however, there was an almost 10% drop from the year previous, while preferences for online and in-person services both increased.

SPOS PREFERRED METHOD OF SERVICE DELIVERY





Since 2021 AMSSA has been developing Francophone resources to better facilitate collaboration the anglophone and francophone sectors.

FRANCOPHONE SERVICES

The most accessed AMSSA resource during the 2022/2023 fiscal year was the 'Francophone Integration Pathway Info Sheet' which was selected by 20.69% of the survey respondents.

SPOS PREFERRED FORMAT TO RECEIVE SECTOR UPDATES








SMALL CENTRES

During the 2022-2023 fiscal year, AMSSA worked in conjunction with Smaller Centre representatives from various regions in BC to co-create a definition for Smaller Centres. Through this process an agreed upon criteria was established to determine if an organization was a 'smaller centre' and/or a 'rural smaller centre' and the definition was shared with survey participants.

When asked to discuss some of the challenges unique to smaller centres, several respondents indicated transportation, more specifically lack of transportation. Geographical distance was also cited as a reason for limited connections between the anglophone and francophone sector.

EARLY YEARS WORKING GROUP

In response to the feedback received during last year's survey, AMSSA is in the process of developing an Early Years Working Group

indicated 'not sure'. Based on some of the longer responses, this did not indicate a lack of interest in the working group, rather respondents may have believed the decision to be out of their scope.
