A Work Permit Holder is a person who holds any type of valid work permit.

SETTLEMENT SERVICES

- Settlement services are programs and services that can help newcomers to Canada.
- The Province of BC funds settlement services through the BC Newcomer Services Program (BCNSP).
- BCNSP is offered by community service providers across the province.
- Settlement workers at these organizations can often provide help in a newcomer's first language in addition to English and/or French.
- Settlement services offered through BCNSP are free.

BCNSP OVERVIEW

- BCNSP helps Work Permit Holders adjust to life and work in Canada.
- Work Permit Holders can receive supports such as help with settling in Canada, job support, and learning English.
- Services may vary by organization, but often include one-to-one information, workshops, and referral to other services as needed.
- External providers supporting Work Permit Holders in need of settlement services are encouraged to refer their clients to a local BCNSP service provider.

SERVICES AVAILABLE

GENERAL

SETTLEMENT SERVICES

- Information about life in their new community and support connecting with community members
- Immigration application information and help completing non-immigration related forms
- Short-term non-clinical counseling
- Referrals to other services as needed

LABOUR MARKET SERVICES

- Information about the local job market and workplace culture
- Short-term pre-employment training and help accessing external employment programs
- Help with job search and career planning
- Information on workplace rights and safety
- Support if an employer is not following workplace safety or employment standards

LANGUAGE SERVICES

- Informal language practice
- Formal English language training for those who meet all the following criteria:
 - a) live outside of Metro Vancouver
 - b) hold a valid work permit of at least one year in length
 - c) intend to live in their area on a long-term basis

Available services may vary by location.
