Job Summary:

The Child Care Worker at New Beginnings Young Parent Daycare and at the Eagle's Nest Early Learning Centre will plan and implement a developmentally appropriate childcare program, offering a nurturing environment for the care of children, encouraging their intellectual, physical, and emotional growth. This position will require knowledge of the Early Learning Framework and will work in close cooperation with the Child Care Supervisor, school staff and other Child Care Workers.

Your Role:

Archway's Child Care Worker with New Beginnings and Eagle's Nest contributes by:

- Working with the children, family, staff, and supervisor to provide an engaging early childhood experience.
- Carrying out developmentally appropriate activities and experiences for the children, which may include indoor/outdoor, and active/quiet activities.
- Attending to the children's physical needs which may include toileting, eating, sleeping, and other basic needs.
- Attending to the children's psychological and emotional needs which may include cuddling, rocking, and holding the child.
- Providing a healthy, safe, caring, and nurturing environment. Administering First Aid when necessary. Observing and removing potential hazards.
- Building and maintaining relationships with the parents/caregivers, either in person or over the phone.

- Using the Early Learning Framework and emergent curriculum to provide an environment that reflects the interests of the child.
